BROOKER MEMORIAL DENTAL CARE

Parents of Botelle School students, please make sure you have your forms in to get a dental exam this month for your child. Brooker Memorial's hygienist, Deb Ravlin, will be visiting in February for two days. Don't miss out on this opportunity for dental care. All children are eligible to receive dental cleanings, fluoride, oral health screenings and sealants in grades Pre-K through eighth grade. This is funded through a grant from the Foundation for Community Health. Parents are asked to provide

dental insurance information and give Brooker Memorial permission to bill the insurance to help offset the cost of this program. If anyone does not have insurance, families will not be billed for services provided at school.
